This will leave a one-time payment of \$16,334. This project will allow us to overhaul all switches and routers throughout the school district.

This will allow us to continue with our current service provider and, at the same time, upgrade our internet access speed. This cost will be submitted for E-rate reimbursement which should pay for 90% of the costs (\$32,022). This will allow the district continued access to the internet and increase network speed.
