Title I School Parent and Family Engagement Policy

Policy involvement

Salem High School holds its Title I annual parent meeting during the back-to-school night (September 21, 2022) at Salem High School. At this meeting the Principal:

- informs parents/guardians of programs and activities provided with Title I funds within the school,
- explains the federal requirements for participation in the federal Title I program,
- and inform parents/guardians of their right to be involved.

The Salem High School Principal ensures that parents/guardians are involved in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs and the school parent and family engagement effort as a part of the Annual School Plan (ASP) development. These meetings occur in October and March. Additionally, any parent that finds the Annual School Plan not satisfactory, Salem High School will submit parent comments on the ASP.

A flexible number of meetings shall be offered, such as meetings in the morning or evening. Transportation, child care, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement may be provided with Title I funds. Salem High School provides flexible meetings within their parent teacher conferences, attendance meetings, and guidance meetings.

Specifically, parents/guardians of participating children at Salem High School:

- A. Receive timely information about programs and activities provided with Title I funds such as entrance to college support, family coach, and summer school support.
- B. Receive a description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school, the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, and the achievement levels of the New Jersey Student Learning Standards; and

- C. If requested by parents/guardians, be provided opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children, and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

Building Capacity for Parent and Family Engagement

The superintendent shall ensure effective involvement of parents/guardians and implement appropriate measures to support a partnership among the schools, parents/guardians, and the community to improve student academic achievement. The superintendent or his or her designee shall ensure that each of the district schools shall at a minimum:

- A. Provide assistance to parents/guardians in understanding New Jersey Student Learning Standards, the New Jersey Department of Education approved statewide proficiency assessments, school administered assessments, the requirements under federal law, and how to monitor a child's progress and work with educators to improve the achievement of their children by mailing ISR to parents with department of ed links explaining standards and assessments.
- B. Provide materials and training to help parents to work with their children to improve their children's achievement through back-to-school night, student orientation, student handbook, website, school-based mental health services, Collegewise, and through services such as Effective School Solutions.
- C. Educate teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties

between parents and the school. These occur during individual meetings with counselors, along with FASFA night and in the Mr. LaBounty from Collegewise.

- D. Coordinate and integrate parent involvement programs and activities to the extent feasible, with other Federal, State, and local programs, including public preschool programs, and conduct other activities, that support involvement; such as back to school night, Salem at a glance, parent-teacher conference, and booster club.
- E. Ensure that information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to the parents of participating children in a format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand; and
