Salem Middle School Title I School Parent and Family Engagement Policy

Policy involvement

Salem Middle School holds its Title I annual parent meeting during the back-to-school night (September 22, 2022) at Salem Middle School. At this meeting the Principal:

- informs parents/guardians of programs and activities provided with Title I funds within the school,
- explains the federal requirements for participation in the federal Title I program,
- and inform parents/guardians of their right to be involved.

The Salem Middle School Principal ensures that parents/guardians are involved in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs and the school parent and family engagement effort as a part of the Annual School Plan (ASP) development. These meetings occur in four times per year. Additionally, any parent that finds the Annual School Plan not satisfactory, Salem Middle School will submit parent comments on the ASP.

Salem Middle School provides flexible meetings within their parent teacher conferences, attendance meetings, and guidance meetings.

- C. If requested by parents/guardians, be provided opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children, and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

Building Capacity for Parent and Family Engagement
